Protection

Each year, tons of leaves and grass clippings end up in storm drains, posing a threat to our waterways. As yard waste decomposes, it releases nutrients that promote the growth of harmful algae and aquatic weeds, disrupting the balance of our ecosystems. Prevent localized flooding by keeping drains clear.

Keep Fats, Bils, and Grease But of Bur Waterways

Pouring fats, oils, and grease (FOG) down drains can clog pipes, cause sewage overflows, and pollute waterways. Proper disposal protects plumbing, wildlife, and the environment. The best way for homeowners to dispose of grease is to let it cool completely, then pour it into a sealed container (like an empty coffee can) and throw it in the regular trash
